About Walter Chase



Walter Chase is a former gang member from Maryland who changed his life through the help and guidance of strong mentors. At age 21, he faced the choice of jail time or military service, so he joined the military and served in the U.S. Army, Special Forces, and the 175th Infantry. He is a graduate of Chesapeake Community College, the University of Maryland College Park, and a graduate of the Landmark Education, Introduction to the Forum Leaders Program. Now, he mentors youth and teens that are on the path to dropping out, getting suspended from school, or going to jail.

Walter designed the child safety board game "Scenarios" for which he was awarded the Martin Luther King Lifetime Achievement Award for community service. He is the founder of Fighting Chance, Inc. and the "See It Through" Gang Prevention and Mentorship Program. Walter has lead personal protection seminars and provided protective services for women and children nationally, including high-risk supervised visitation. He is a member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity and served on the boards of the Vancouver Police Activities League (P.A.L.), Martial Artist Against Drugs (M.A.A.D.), and Soul River Runs Wild, a non-profit organization that brings youth and Veterans together. He has been featured on KOIN 6 Evening News and KATU 2 AM Northwest.
